# **ROLL CALL**

# VISITOR'S

Resolution #10 was presented. It is a resolution reducing the police officers' contributions to the pension plan for the year 2023. A motion to pass resolution #10 was made by Trish Corle seconded by Mark Wissinger. A roll call vote was taken with all present members voting yes. The motion carried.

Mayor Ralph Boyle said they sent out invitations to a banquet for those that helped during the jubilee. He also said they profited a little over \$25,700.00 from this year's jubilee.

# STREETS AND PROPERTY

Sean Simmons said he got price quotes for new doors. To replace the one-man door to go into the garage, the cost would be between \$875.00-\$1000.00. A motion was made by Cindy Dom to spend up to \$1000.00 for the purchase of a new door for the street department entrance, seconded by Mark Wissinger. The motion carried.

They started picking up leaves this week.

The new spreader is on and ready to go. Westmont Borough is interested in purchasing the old spreader. Sean is working with them regarding the price.

#### TREES

Art presented council with two bids to trim the trees on Plainfield Avenue. Both bids were for \$2500.00. One bid was from the Tree Expert and the other was from Climber Tree Services. A motion was made by Mark Wissinger to accept the bid from Climber Tree Services seconded by Connie Hobbs. The motion carried.

## SEWER/SEWER PROJECT REPORT

Frank DiLoreto was present from EADS.

Two pressure tests were completed in September. An updated letter for pressure testing requirements was provided to Nancy.

Hystone Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation: Closeout documentation has been sent to Snyder for execution. EADS is waiting for Snyder to return signed information to close out the project. Payment is to be held until documentation is received. EADS will complete the closeout for the project once the documentation is received from Snyder. Synder acknowledged that their work caused the sinkhole and will make the necessary repairs on Hystone Ave.

Station St Walkway Rehabilitation Project: The retaining wall will be designed with Stone Strong Blocks and the contractor will be responsible for obtaining sealed drawings. EADS has been discussing with Stone Strong about the design and is nearing completion for the retaining wall.

Local Share Account Statewide Program & GTRP Program: Announcement for the grants is anticipated to be the end of 2022.

DCED Small Water and Sewer/H2O Grants: Grants will be submitted for the following projects: Goucher St Storm Sewer Rehabilitation, Manhole Rehabilitation and Stormwater improvements throughout the borough. Eligible projects require a 15% match. Applications are due December 21, 2022.

DCNR Community Conservation Partnership Program (Park Rehabilitation and Development): Open discussion for public input. Resolution #11 was presented. A motion was made by Eric Baumbaugh to pass resolution #11, seconded by Cindy Dom. A roll call vote was taken with all present members voting yes. The motion carried.

PennDot MTF Grant Application: Grant will be prepared to replace the walking track lights around the Rigby Park. Grant application due November 14<sup>th</sup>, 30% match will be required. Resolution #12 was presented. Trish Corle made a motion to pass resolution #12 as an emergency situation because of the timing for EADS to submit the grant. The motion was seconded by Art Boring. A roll call vote was taken with all present members voting yes. The motion carried.

# TAX COLLECTOR'S REPORT

Tax Collector's Report was presented for September 2022. Total amount collected was \$2,006.16.

A motion to pay all Accounts Payable was made by Trish Corle, seconded by Art Boring. The motion carried.

Attorney Green also reviewed the ordinance for the visitors present. A motion was made Art Boring to accept and pass ordinance # 502 seconded by Cindy Dom. A roll call vote was taken with all present members voting yes. The motion carried.
